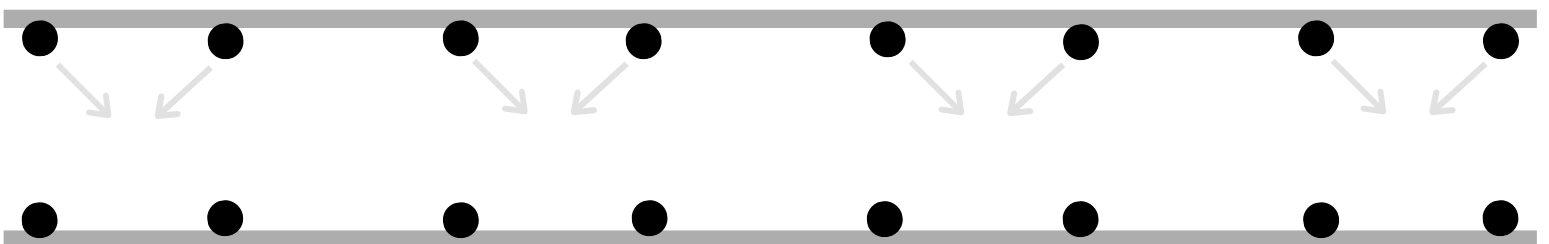
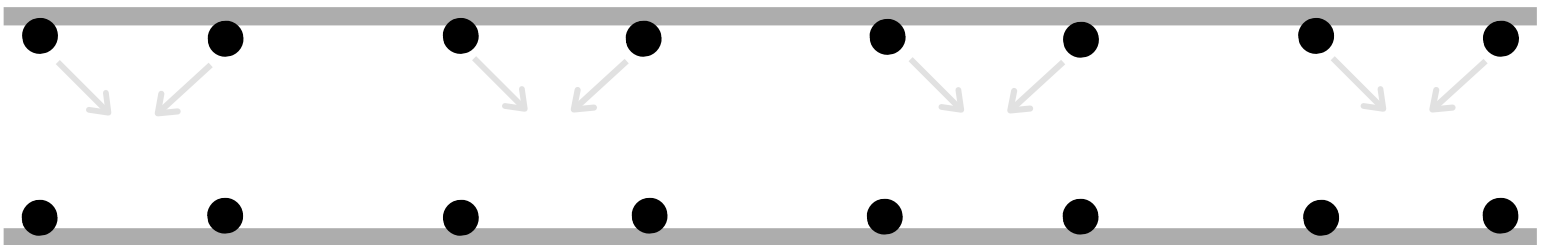
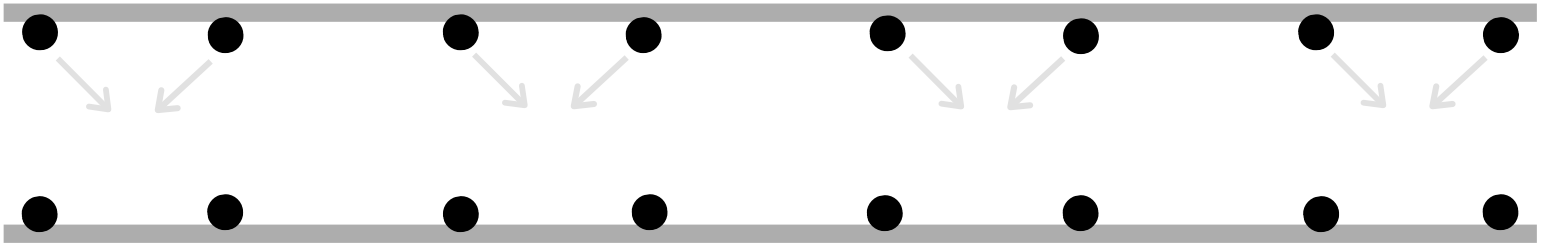
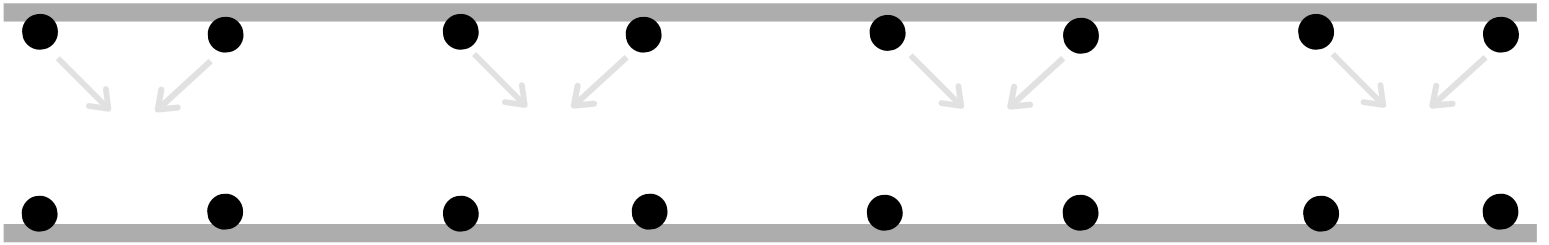


Nice! Now try your best to stay inside of the green lines!



Now let's draw our X shapes!

Draw a line from the top left dot down to its matching bottom right dot.  
Then draw a line from the top right dot down to its matching bottom left dot.



Finish out strong! Keep drawing our X shapes!

The worksheet contains 12 sets of horizontal lines, each set consisting of two parallel lines. On each line, there are six black dots. The dots are arranged in two columns of three on each line. This layout is designed for children to draw 'X' shapes by connecting the dots on the top line to the dots on the bottom line.
