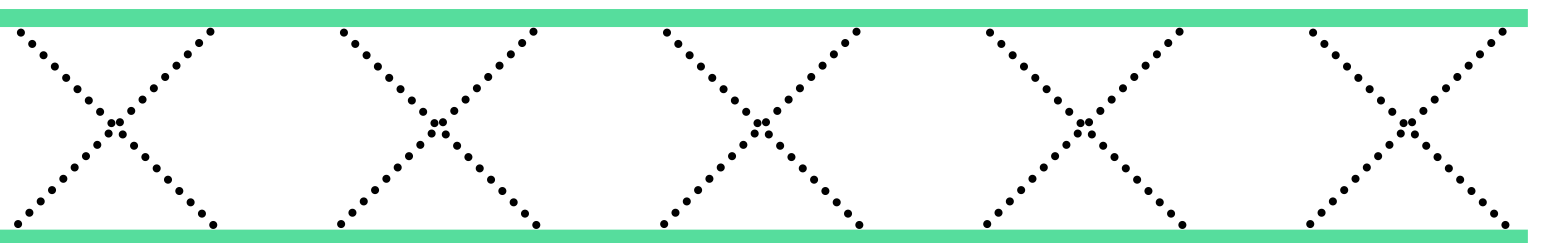
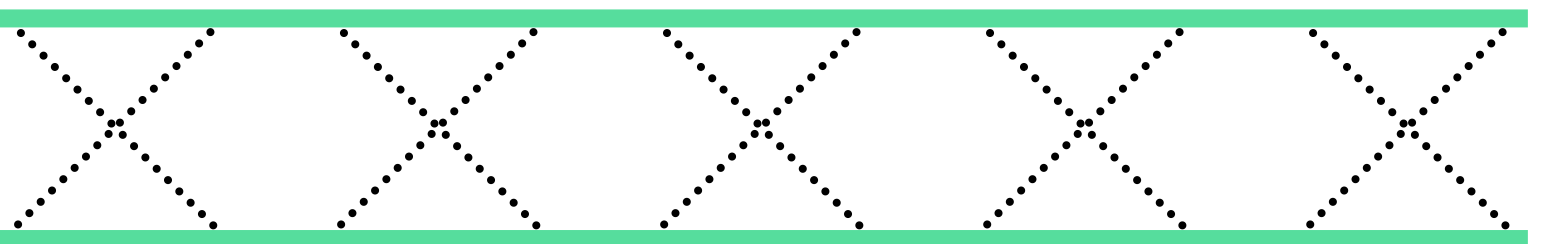
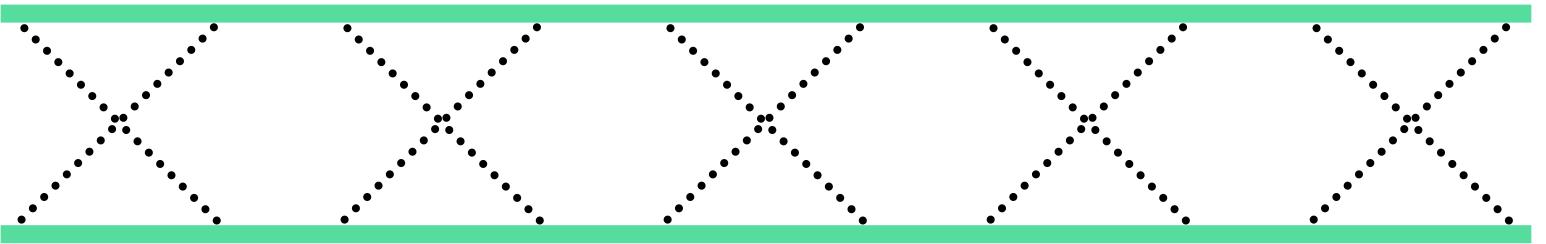
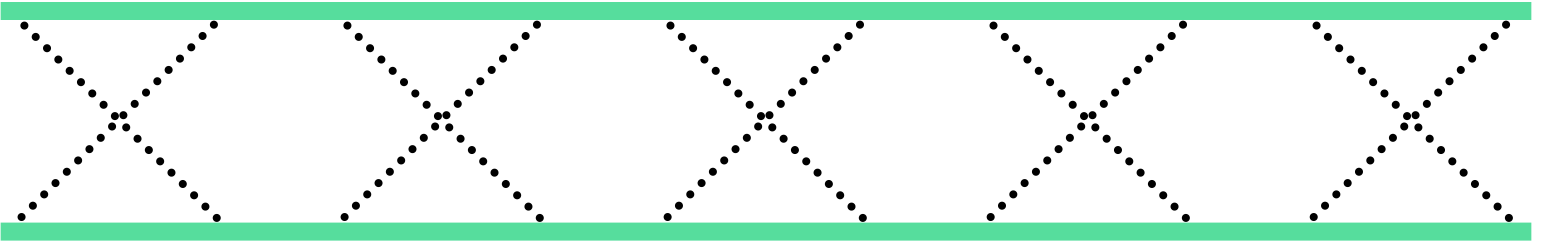
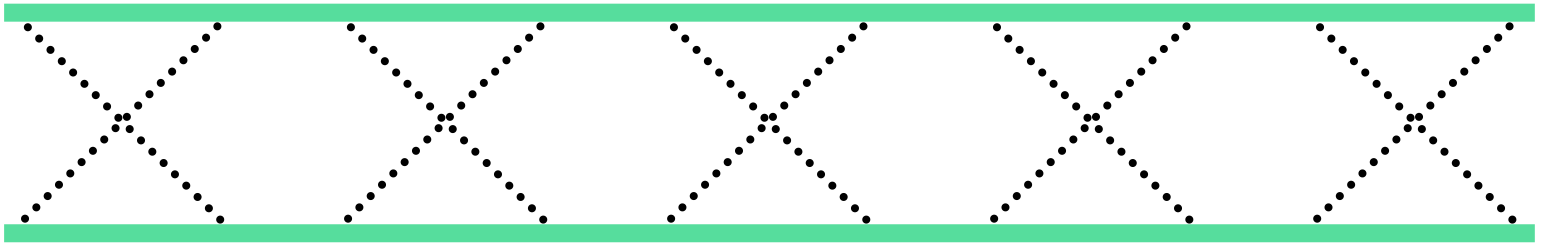
Trace each X shape below.

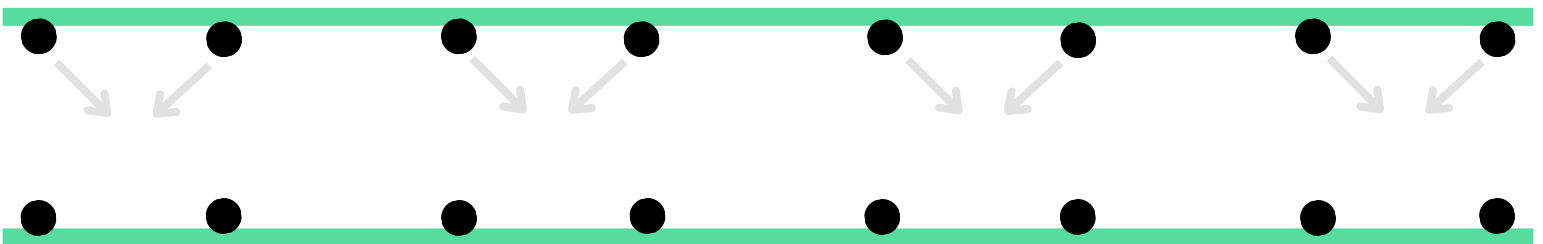
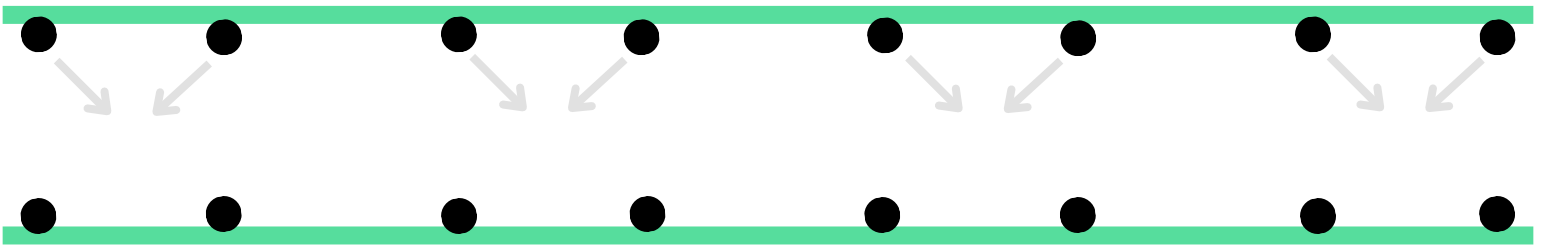
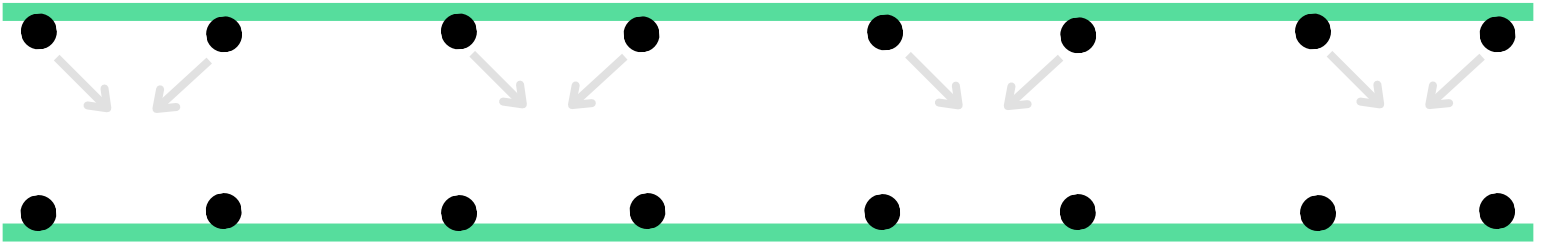
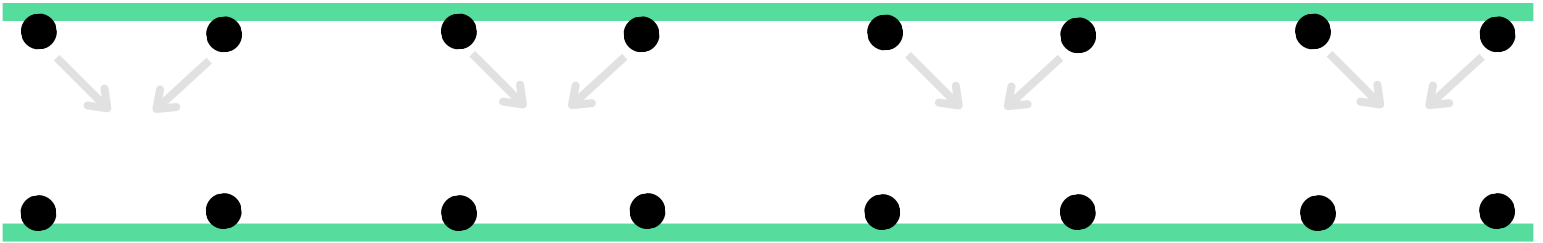


Nice! Now try your best to stay inside of the green lines!

Then draw a line from the top right dot down to its matching bottom left dot.
